#### Wellesbourne Area:

282-02/10 Warwickshire College, Moreton Morrell

Between 11:00 and 14:00. Driver's window of a van smashed. Theft of an iPhone and a suit in a bag.

Approx. 23:30. Window smashed by a brick which landed inside the property.

Report of a male trying the doors of vehicles. No reports of anything being stolen.

Approx. 02:45. Attempted break-in by forced entry. Car driven off at speed. House to house enquiries were carried out at neighbouring properties.

Vehicle involved in a collision with a stag.

382-23/10 Walton Road, Wellesbourne

*We are appealing for witnesses and information after a woman was assaulted.*

*At around 14:00, a woman was walking along Walton Road in the direction of Walton Hall when she passed a group of men on pushbikes.*

*One of the men assaulted the victim, a woman in her 70s, from behind causing her to fall to the floor. She sustained two broken wrists, bruising to her lower back, bruising to her arms, a black eye and grazing to her knees.*

*The suspect is described as a white male, wearing grey clothing and with a grey push bike. He is believed to have spoken with an Eastern European accent.*

*Investigating officer PC Abigail Smith said: "While no arrests have been made, investigations are ongoing to establish the circumstances surrounding this nasty, unprovoked assault which has left a woman with significant injuries.*

*"We know that a number of people would have been in the area at around the time of the incident so I would appeal to anyone who may have witnessed it to please come forward.*

*"I would also urge anyone who may have seen a group of men on their pushbikes in the area to also get in touch."*

342-25/10 Pickard Place, Wellesbourne

Suspicious circumstances-at approx. 19:30 occupants heard a vehicle outside and reported someone taking photographs of their vehicle.

390-26/10 Loxley Road, Wellesbourne

Vehicle involved in a collision with a deer. Considerable damage to vehicle.

018-27/10 Hotchkiss Close, Wellesbourne

Suspicious circumstances-at approx. 02:15 occupant saw two males looking at property and one went near to parked cars.

# Deer Aware



## When are deer around?

Deer cross the roads all year round. However their presence peaks in April and May when territorial deer and young deer are dispersing and from October to November when deer will be on the move for the autumn mating season. This is around the times the clocks go forward and back. Take particular care at dawn and dusk.



## Seen one? Look for another

If a deer crosses in front of you, it is likely that another will follow. If it is safe to do so, slow right down or stop and wait. Deer are unpredictable, drive with caution.



## Be aware

Deer often cross the roads in the same locations. Deer warning signs are put up where deer are known to cross regularly.

When you see a warning sign or are travelling through a heavily wooded stretch of road, slow down, stay alert and be prepared to stop.



## What to do if you hit a deer

### Call the emergency services on 999 if:

Anyone is seriously injured or there is a danger to others using the road e.g. a deer (alive or dead) is blocking the road or is a danger to the traffic.

### Call the non-emergency line on 101 if:

The deer is injured and on the side of the road, not causing a danger to traffic. The police will deal with any traffic issues and have access to specialists who will know the best course of action to take if the deer is still alive.

### What to say

Give as much detail as possible about your location, perhaps using an app such as what3words if you have it.

Give them your mobile number, if possible, so they can call you back.
